



GIRLS HOSTEL NO. 1

With the admission of girls in the College of Veterinary Science, Khanapara, the need arose for a girl's hostel. Under the wardenship of Dr. Dinesh Borpujari, Professor of Biochemistry, the girls were temporarily accommodated in teachers and staff quarters. By 1978, Ms. Junu Rani Dutta joined as the Lady Welfare Officer with additional charge of the girl's hostel. Consequently, Girls Hostel 01 became ready for occupation in 1983. Ms Dutta served as warden from 1983 till 2011. On 1st January, 2012 Dr. B. K. Sarma have taken the charge of Warden till 31.05.2017. After that Dr. Munmun Sarma was appointed as Warden from 01.06. 2018 till 06.02.2021 followed by Ms Archana Talukdar who served as Warden till March, 2024. Dr Sadhana Choudhury is the present warden of Girls Hostel No 01.

1. Basic Information

Girls Hostel No. 01, established in 1983, is a dedicated residential facility for female students, offering a safe and supportive living environment within the campus. The hostel was first supervised by Ms. Junurani Dutta, whose guidance contributed to its strong foundation.

The hostel has a total intake capacity of 150 students and currently accommodates 138 residents. The infrastructure includes one G+1 building along with an additional Assam-type structure, providing a blend of traditional and functional design. In total, the hostel comprises 67 rooms, designed to ensure a comfortable and conducive atmosphere for academic and personal growth.

2. Room Details

The hostel offers a variety of accommodation options, including single, double, triple, and dormitory-style rooms, catering to the diverse needs and preferences of residents.

To ensure safe and clean drinking water, the hostel is equipped with a reliable RO water purification system, providing access to high-quality potable water at all times.

3. Mess & Dining Facility

The hostel provides a well-maintained mess facility for its residents, offering both vegetarian and non-vegetarian meals to suit varied dietary preferences.

The mess is managed by a Student Committee, ensuring efficient operation and quality service. The dining hall has a seating capacity of 45 students, providing a comfortable space for meals.

The approximate monthly mess charge is ₹1300, making it an affordable option for residents.

4. Facilities Available

The hostel provides a range of facilities to ensure the safety, comfort, and well-being of its residents. A common room is available for relaxation and social interaction, along with TV facilities for entertainment.



Residents also have access to newspapers and magazines to stay updated. The hostel is equipped with power backup, CCTV surveillance, and security guard services to ensure a safe living environment. Additionally, first aid facilities and a visitor's room are available for residents' convenience.

5. Safety & Security

The hostel follows a regulated schedule to ensure the safety and discipline of its residents. Entry and exit timings are set at 7:00 PM during summer and 6:30 PM during winter, while the main gate closes at 7:00 PM. Visitors are permitted between 3:00 PM and 5:00 PM.

For security, the hostel is equipped with CCTV surveillance, and security personnel are present during night hours to maintain safety. Additionally, fire safety equipment is available on the premises to handle emergencies effectively.
