



GIRLS' HOSTEL NO.1

Girls' Hostel No. 1 was established in 2017 with the objective of providing safe and comfortable accommodation for female students. The first batch comprised 15 students, who successfully completed their studies and graduated in 2020. The hostel mess is managed by the student community and offers both vegetarian and non-vegetarian options. Three meals are served daily; breakfast, lunch, and dinner for residents. The hostel provides essential amenities, including a common room, television, and indoor games, to support recreation and overall well-being. At present, the hostel accommodates 29 undergraduate students and 10 interns.

1. Basic Information

Girls' Hostel No. 1, established in 2017, is a residential facility dedicated to accommodating female students of the University. The first warden of the hostel was Dr. Henguli Pathak. The hostel has an approved intake capacity of 36 students and is presently accommodating 39 residents. The building consists of two floors and comprises 18 residential rooms along with one sick room to attend to minor health needs of the students. The hostel continues to provide a safe and supportive living environment for its residents within the University campus.

2. Room Details

The hostel provides double-occupancy rooms designed to ensure comfortable accommodation for students. Safe drinking water is available through both RO

purification and filtered water systems, ensuring a reliable supply of clean and hygienic water for all residents.

3. Mess & Dining Facility

The hostel has a functional mess that provides both vegetarian and non-vegetarian meals for residents. The mess is managed by a student committee, ensuring active participation of students in its operation. The dining hall can accommodate up to 36 students at a time. The approximate mess charge is ₹2,000 per month.

4. Facilities Available

The hostel provides several essential facilities for the comfort and well-being of its residents. A common room equipped with a television is available for recreation and relaxation. Students also have access to indoor games for leisure activities. Power backup is provided in the dining hall to ensure uninterrupted meal services. In addition, first aid facilities are available to address minor medical needs, and a visitor's room is provided for meeting guests in a designated space.

5. Safety & Security

The hostel maintains regulated entry and exit to ensure the safety of residents. Students are required to enter the hostel by 6:00 PM, and the main gate is closed at 9:00 PM. Visitors are permitted up to 7:00 PM only. Security arrangements include an inner gate managed by the students, while the outer gate is closed at 9:00 PM. The entire hostel premises are secured by solid concrete boundary walls, providing a safe and protected residential environment.
